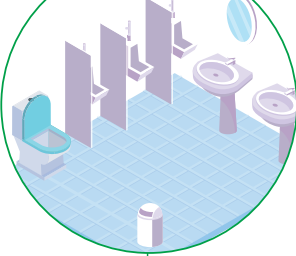




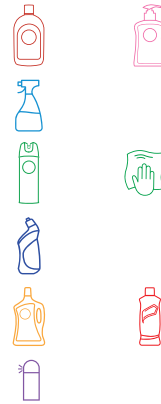
Your Guide to Hygienic Cleaning

RESTROOM



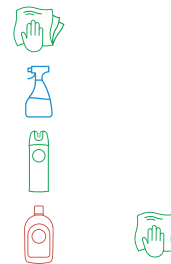
- Wash Basin Surface & Tap

GUEST ROOMS



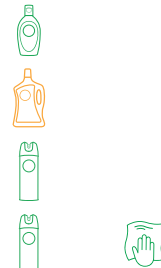
- TV Remote & Light Switches

COMMON AREAS



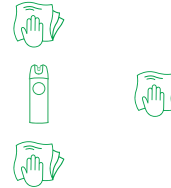
- Entrance/ Reception Area
